## **Cleaning Berber Carpet**

Although it is a nice alternative to cut pile carpet, Berber carpet can be difficult to clean. Many people

have found that after cleaning Berber carpet, the stains and dirt seem to return to the surface of the carpet. This is partly due to the loop pile construction, as it tends to dry slower. To achieve quicker dry times the technician should use more dry vacuum passes and increase air movement to mitigate any potential wicking issues. Even though it might seem difficult at first, Berber carpet can be cleaned effectively when the right techniques are applied.

Dry soil removal is a critical step in carpet cleaning, particularly when cleaning Berber carpets. You can do this by vacuuming the carpet thoroughly before applying any water or cleaning solution.

If you do not remove this loose soil first, it will resurface after you have cleaned it and the carpet begins to dry. Water evaporates from the carpet fibers by capillary action, and this is the process that creates soil wicking: The water evaporates from the surface of the carpet, but the soil cannot. When you are vacuuming the carpet, pay close attention to the areas where you switch directions (pivot areas), these will be the areas most prone to resurfacing soil.

Clean spills as quickly as possible to avoid letting the stain set in. When spot cleaning Berber carpet, it is important that you do not scrub the pile. This will cause the stain to set and will also cause damage to the texture. Instead, blot the liquid to remove as much of it as possible before it has a chance to set it.

For stains that have already set in on a synthetic fiber, you will need to spray the stained area with an oxidizer, i.e., Hydrogen Peroxide. Let the cleaner soak into the carpet for a few minutes. Once the cleaner has been allowed to soak, blot it with a cloth. Again, do not scrub as this will make the stain worse. When you don't see any more discoloration transfer to the cloth, place a clean cloth over the discoloration and add a weight overnight.

To maintain a fresh look, Berber carpets should be professionally cleaned twice a year so that stains are not allowed to set in.
